The Position

Arkansas State University Campus Queretaro invites applications for a full-time Oral Communication professor. We seek a colleague who can instruct students on the theory and practice of communication in public speaking contexts, with emphasis on how to write and present well-organized, logical, and informative speeches.

Responsibilities:

- Instruction of a standard teaching load of five courses per semester for instructor faculty. This includes preparing syllabi and classes, conducting assessment, providing feedback and academic advice, and developing courses.
- Dedication of some office hours to tutoring at the Student Success Center in order to foster a climate of academic excellence and participation in faculty committees.
- Additional responsibilities may include recruitment of students and faculty for our growing campus and support in the development of our industry network to establish collaborations, provide events on campus, and facilitate potential employment opportunities for our students.

Qualifications:

- At least a master's degree in the discipline or in a related field.
- Must demonstrate fluency in the language of instruction, English
- Educational and/or teaching experience in the United States preferred
- Commitment to liberal arts education and interest in primarily teaching courses in Oral Communication, as well as possible communication electives
